# Join in on the Birding Blitz Fun at the Blitz Awards Brunch on Sunday, April 28th

The April SIAS meeting will take place at the Haven Day Lodge, on the shore of Crab Orchard Lake, on Sunday, April 28<sup>th</sup> at 10 a.m. Join us as we celebrate the 22<sup>nd</sup> Birding Blitz at the Blitz Competition Brunch and Awards Ceremony. Drinks and snacks will be provided.

For participants, the Brunch starts at 9:30 a.m. Team species lists are to be turned in by 10 a.m. We'll introduce all teams and team members and compile a combined total species list for the day. Then we'll announce the winners of each category.

This is a fun opportunity to meet birders from throughout Illinois and surrounding states. You'll be surprised to find out how much fun the awards brunch can be as you listen to the stories told of team Blitz Day experiences. While the Blitz is a competition, a wonderful camaraderie exists between all participants. Because, even though the Blitz is a competition, all team members really want to do is see and/or hear as many birds as they can. And it's hard to beat southernmost IL for spring birding.

We've held our Awards Brunch at the Haven location for several years now. It is a beautiful, spacious, rustic lodge with big windows that provide an awe inspiring view of Crab Orchard Lake. The Haven is located on the south side of IL Rt. 13, at 10289 Haven Ln., Carbondale, opposite the Cambria Road turnoff.

It not too late to register a team if you're interested in participating. Registration is \$25 per person. A team has to have a minimum of two members and chose a category to compete in. Each participant gets a Blitz t-shirt.



We ask that participants come up with a unique team name. And teams must raise a minimum of \$100 in pledges that will go towards habitat acquisition, restoration and preservation.

If you can't participle, please consider donating a pledge to one of the six teams competing. In the 22 years that the Blitz has been taking place, participants have raised over \$50,000 for habitat restoration and preservation in the Cache River Wetlands.



**March Program Highlights** We thank Dr. Nancy Garwood for introducing us to Yasuni National Park and sharing her years of work. The Yasuni National Park, in the Ecuadorian Amazon, was established in 1979 and is incredibly diverse with regard to species. The area of 3,900 square miles is home to more than 4000 vascular plants, ~600 bird species, ~140 amphibians, ~120 reptiles, ~200 mammals, more than 400 fishes, and ~100,000 insects. Over 130 of these are globally threatened.

Dr. Nancy Garwood shared her enthusiasm with and dedication to her work at Yasuni National Park. Her first projects, 50 years ago in Panama, were community level studies of the earliest stages of forest regeneration after earthquake-caused landslides and the phenology of seed dispersal and germination. She recently

returned to initiate a comparative phenological study. Phenology is the study of cyclic and seasonal natural phenomena in relation to climate and plant and animal life.

Part of Nancy's work included a collaborative effort to produce a guide for identifying the common trees of the area. The book, The Common Trees of Yasuni: A Guide for Identifying the Common Trees of the Ecuadorian Amazon, contains 250 species organized by the morphology of their leaves. The book is available in Spanish and English. Funding is being sought so to produce the book in Huaorani, the language of the indigenous Huaorani peoples. *-Rhonda R.* 



## **Volunteer Butterfly Monitors Needed**

The Illinois Butterfly Monitoring Network (IBMN) and Illinois Odonate Survey (IOS) are recruiting Citizen Science volunteers to monitor these populations in Southern Illinois. Monitors are needed for several public land sites and may be given a trail already mapped by IBMN or IOS, with locations that are close to their home community. Volunteers pledge to turn in at least 8 surveys of their assigned trail between mid-May and late August. These trails can usually be walked at a slow pace in about one to two hours. It is strongly encouraged that potential monitors register and view the "2024 Southern Illinois Workshops" online at the IBMN website: https://ibmn.org/ or YouTube IBMN site before they attend these field events.

Also, participants are asked to pre-register for the field training by calling Crab Orchard NWR Visitor Ctr. (618.997.3344), Barkhausen Cache River Wetland Ctr (618.657.2064), or Giant City State Pk (618.457.4836).

There is no charge for the training or the workshops. Bring binoculars if you have them, sack lunches, a water bottle and appropriate clothing for outdoor walking. Participants are welcome to attend both days. New monitors must attend at least the first day's session. Both days will offer valuable information for returning experienced monitors. The workshop plan is:

#### Saturday May 4 - Focus on Butterflies

10:00AM to Noon: Field Training.

Meet at the Crab Orchard NWR Visitor's Center and we will walk to the Headquarters Prairie. This site will be used to demonstrate a monitoring walk using the Pollard protocol.

Noon to 1PM : Lunch at the Visitors Center patio (participants are asked to bring a sack lunch) or Harmony Trail picnic area.

1PM to 3:30PM: Field Training. We will caravan from the CONWR Visitor's Center to Cache River Wetland Ctr, meeting in the Visitor's Center and hiking nearby.

## Spring Trash Blasts on the Shawnee National Forest

First Friday of each month, 1:00-3:00 p.m.

The USDA Shawnee National Forest Service, Friends of the Shawnee, and the IL Extension Office will partner to host these annual spring Trash Blasts! They will happen on the first Friday in May & June from 1:00-3:00 p.m. at various locations in the Shawnee National Forest. Attendees will break into small teams of volunteers to collect litter from selected sites. No matter what we find, we try to remove it to help restore the area to its natural state. Volunteers should wear sturdy shoes, bring their leather work gloves, wear long pants, and closed-toed shoes. If you do not have leather gloves we can help provide them for you. Trash buckets and trash grabbers will be provided for volunteers to use during the trash blast. This event is limited to 30 participants. Dates & locations: May 3rd at Bean Ridge (Alexander County), June 7 at Ripple Hollow (Union County). ## **INaturalist Bioblitz at Cypress Creek NW Refuge**

These lists are useful for visitors to the refuge but are also used for planning purposes by the USFWS. The Friends of the Cache will be hosting an INaturalist bioblitz the weekend of April 27th & -28th to give a boost to the number of species on the list. To participate in the Bioblitz, upload your observations on the iNaturalist app from anywhere within the refuge. Your observations will automatically be added to the Biodiversity of Cypress Creek NWR project. 
### GreenEarth C'dale Big 50th Celebration
